The episode of David and Goliath is one of the most well-known events in the Old Testament. For children, it entails a brave young shepherd boy who defeats a giant brute with a slingshot. For the disciple, it stands as a salient metaphor for the crushing of the serpent's head. However, behind this momentous event lies a hidden allegory. The brutal dispatching of the giant of Gath transports us to one of the most intimate and tender moments Jesus has with his Father on record: the time when he is found praying in a garden called Gethsemane.
